
# Reading at Home

This week you will hopefully have found that your child has a reading diary and a range of reading books in their book bags. On the first page of their diary, you will find a label stating



which day your child's books will be changed. <u>Please ensure that your child's books are sent into school each day</u> as it is likely they will read with an adult in school. When you have read with your child, please log this in their reading diary with any additional comments you may wish to add. Please note this does not need to be extensive, simply dating and listing the book read, along with who it was read to is adequate.

If you would like to volunteer to read with children in school, please let me know.



Some of you may be new to our Monster Phonics scheme. Please do contact me if you require further information/support other than that shared at the welcome meeting.



Each week your child will come home with flashcards representing the corresponding graphemes and high frequency words we have been learning in class. Please take the time to recap these with your child to consolidate their learning and give them the opportunity to show their phonics skills. Lots of repetition will support your child in their understanding and their ability to read and write. You may also wish to log when you do this in your child's reading diary.

Again, please ensure that the pouch with the cards in is kept in their book bag so it can be added to each week.

#### Yammer

As you know, Yammer is now our main forum for communication. Please try to access our class and parent page regularly to ensure you are aware of things going on in class/school. All information is shared via Yammer and often requires a response.

### Class Rewards

In previous years, children have been awarded Star of the Day. Due to the number of children in the class we have decided to change this to Star of the Week. Children <u>may</u> be awarded Star of the Week for single occurrences rather than whole week efforts. This will be in addition to our whole school celebrations for Shining Stars of the Week. We also have a whole class tick chart system. Once the children have filled the chart, they will receive a treat/reward of their choosing.

#### Curriculum Overview

Our topic this term is **All About Me**. Across the term we will be establishing routines and getting to know the children, following their interests in play. We will also be carrying out the Reception Baseline Assessment to identify what the children can do already. Please see the table below for an overview of our learning.

Area of Learning	Learning Intentions
Communication and Language	We will begin to identify what makes a good listener and speaker. We will discuss the routines of the day, modelling language particularly in play.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	We will focus on developing friendly behaviour and relationships with children in class. We will discuss people who are special to us and what makes us who we are.
Physical Development	We will learn how to explore space safely, including travelling movements and balances. We will begin to make marks and shapes using simple equipment.
Literacy	We will develop a comprehensive understanding of core texts, discussing them as a class. We will learn to recall parts of a story and characters, write our names, recognise repetition and alliteration, recap phase 1 and begin phase 2 phonics.
Mathematics	We will begin to learn to count on to 10 and back, ordering numerals and matching them to corresponding quantities. We will also begin to identify simple 2D and 3D shapes in our environment.
Understanding the World	We will talk about our surroundings and local community, parts of the body, listening to sounds and their source, healthy food, facial features, and emotions.
Expressive Arts and Design	We will begin to develop the skills and knowledge required to identify a pulse in music, exploring instruments and body percussion. We will use familiar materials and introduce new tools to explore colours and textures.
RE	We will discuss stories from the Bible, making links to those that are special to us in our families. We will identify stories that are special to Christians and Muslims, discussing similarities and differences. Learning new Hymns.
